## About FIMRC

# COMPASSION

Foundation for International Medical Relief of Children (FIMRC) is a 501(c)3 global nonprofit organization. FIMRC is dedicated to improving the lives of children worldwide by providing medical support and health education. FIMRC engages over 4,000 volunteers internationally, with over 80 core members in the U.S.

# EDUCATION

FIMRC invests in long-term community health by holding preventative health education sessions on a regular basis to empower community members to take charge of their own health. Field staff travel to schools, soup kitchens, and other community centers to reach vulnerable populations.

# HEALTHCARE

As its primary mission, FIMRC establishes and maintains pediatric medical clinics in underserved regions. This includes staffing the clinic with local physicians and nurses; hosting international volunteers at its clinic sites; and raising funds for medical equipment and supplies. FIMRC also supports existing medical facilities with funding and volunteer staffing.

## FIMRC International Medical Sites

### Project Alajuelita, Costa Rica

FIMRC established a clinic in 2005 that now serves 12,000 Nicaraguan immigrants and impoverished Costa Rican citizens per year. The clinic team aims to help Alajuelita residents transition from a system of triage healthcare to one of continuous care and preventative medicine.

### Project Las Delicias, El Salvador

In 2007 FIMRC constructed a primary care medical clinic for this medically underserved community. Project goals include establishing an effective system for delivering acute and preventative healthcare, decreasing pediatric malnutrition and the number of underweight children in the community, and sustaining education programs with a focus on maternal and prenatal health.

### Project Kodaikanal, India

Through a partnership with The Betsy Elizabeth Trust, FIMRC's Project Kodaikanal provides education, nutrition assistance, and primary healthcare to 150 children living in the poverty-stricken community of Kodaikanal, a town located in the hills of Tamil Nadu, India. FIMRC also supports the Van Allen Hospital, which serves as the area's main source of healthcare.

### Project Bumwalukani, Uganda

This project provides direct healthcare to a remote village of approximately 10,000 in southeastern Uganda. In addition to treating common diseases such as malaria and skin infections, staff members conduct preventative health initiatives to curb the spread of HIV and other infections and provide training to community members to educate their peers.



### Project Peru

FIMRC maintains partnerships with medical facilities in the vibrant cities of Trujillo and Huancayo, as well as the rural area of Agallpampa. Staffing is maintained at each site to lead community health campaigns for impoverished children. Global Health Volunteers for Project Peru have the opportunity to shadow the hospital's medical staff alongside Peruvian medical students. FIMRC is currently raising funds for the construction of a mobile clinic to reach Peruvian families without access to medical facilities.

### Project Limon, Nicaragua

FIMRC's Project Limon provides monetary and staffing support to the Roberto Clemente Medical Clinic, a primary care facility located in the remote coastal town of Limon. By placing volunteers to work alongside the clinic's medical team, FIMRC aims to improve pediatric care in the region.
